THE PETITION OF ONE MILLION

A little more than a year ago I had the opportunity to meet with Jakki Jeffs, Executive Director of Alliance for Life Ontario, in regards to her request for support of a concept she was working on *The Petition of One Million*. As a rule we do not give permission for petitions in our churches, but it is important to bring the life issues to the forefront. More importantly, 2019 marks the 50th Anniversary of the loss of protection of children in the womb when our government passed Bill 150, an Omnibus Bill, which decriminalized abortion. *The Petition of One Million* is urging people of good will across Canada to add their name to a list of one million people calling on our government to extend the mantle of legal protection of life once more to our smallest citizens, those in the womb.

Canada has had no law against abortion since 1969. The petition will be presented to the government in September, 2019 and will remind our citizens and our government that there is now, and will always be those of us who will continue to cry out for justice for children in the womb. *-Bishop Douglas Crosby, OMI*


